
## **Recent developments**

- March 2021: Open Access Diamond Journals Study (OADJS). Diamond OA is fragmented, but multilingual, and diverse. *Recommendation*: build a Diamond Capacity Hub to align, coordinate, and improve the sustainability of Diamond OA.
- March 2022: A plan by ANR, cOAlition S, OPERAS, and Science Europe to align and develop common resources for the entire Diamond OA ecosystem, respecting its diversity.
- September 2022: Taken forward by the 3y–€3m DIAMAS project and the 5y–€5m CRAFT-OA project funded by Horizon Europe for Diamond journals in the ERA.
- May 2023: EU Council Conclusions: support for Diamond OA: "Authors should not have to pay fees (...) Non-profit scholarly publishing models should be supported..."
- October 2023: Global Summit on Diamond OA, Toluca. A proposal to launch a Global Diamond OA Alliance. Supported by UNESCO.



## Four levels of organization

## The European Diamond Capacity Hub: Governance

#### Supporting Members - DCH Steering Committee:

Public or non-profit organizations (e.g. charities, foundations, associations, RFOs, RPOs) whose legal mission is to fund and/ or perform research and scholarship.

#### Operational Members - DCH Executive Committee:

National and international organizations that are engaged in aspects of Diamond OA publishing, and willing to provide long-term services to DCH by leading essential DCH Task Forces.

#### Community members – DCH Assembly:

Diamond Capacity Centers and Diamond Institutional Publishers. Community members. The elected Assembly Chair will join the Steering Committee. The Assembly will be extensively consulted on all initiatives.

### Setting Quality Standards for Diamond OA

The Diamond Open Access Standard (DOAS) is both a technical guide and a practical means of benchmarking quality in scholarly publishing. By combining guidelines and a self-assessment tool, DOAS promotes quality in Diamond open access (OA) publishing.

DOAS sets essential and testable criteria to ensure equitable, transparent, and high-quality scholarly publishing. It advocates for a transparent publishing model governed by the academic community.

DOAS is based on the Extensible Quality Standard in Institutional Publishing (EQSIP) developed by the DIAMAS project. This was developed with 70 documents and has been discussed in two iterations, with the input of 300+ people from the Diamond publishing community from all over Europe. DOAS addresses the seven core components of scholarly publishing:

- 1. Funding,
- 2. Legal ownership, mission and governance,
- 3. Open Science,
- Editorial management, editorial quality and research integrity,
- 5. Technical service efficiency,
- 6. Visibility, communication, marketing and impact,
- 7. Equity, Diversity, Inclusion and Belonging (EDIB), multilingualism and gender equity.

Detailed criteria and guidelines in each of these areas were developed through an analysis of existing standards and best practice, and then further refined through community feedback. By addressing each of the seven core components, it advocates for a publishing model accessible to all and controlled by the academic community.



#### How to use DOAS



- Review evidence-based standards in the seven core components of scholarly publishing
- Use the Self-Assessment tool to check your compliance with quality in Diamond OA
- Understand how to move your publishing operations to an equitable model - diamondise vour journals!
- Diamond OA publishers can assess their adherence to DOAS through the self-assessment tool, identifying strengths and weaknesses

The standards are operationalised with a DOAS Self-Assessment tool that assists publishers in evaluating the compliance with



evidence-based Diamond OA Standards. Through the Self-Assessment tool, DOAS equips institutions with resources to assess compliance and enhance publishing practices, facilitating progress towards Diamond OA-level publishing standards.
